▪ FEDERATION REPORT

Dave Long advised the meeting –

- Brian Davey advised that he had ordered 15,000 Logbooks and there are 236 Clubs now members of the Federation
- Registration of vehicles can continue after a person has died until the end of that financial year & the vehicle can be used by a family member if the Club's Constitution doesn't exclude people who have passed away.
- Certain number plates can be handed down in a will, see the link on the Federation's website – different types of plates have different conditions
- If certain plates aren't on a registered bike for 5 years you can lose them

- Engine numbers, addresses and Plate numbers can be changed but not ownership details
- Logbooks & records are required to be kept for 5 years by members and the Clubs
- The Federation is financially well off
