



Eugen Eicher's BSA A65-Engined Entry To The 1985 Paris-Dakar Rally







In the spirit of the recently-completed Dakar Rally, here's a 'home-built' special that embodies the 'give it a go' attitude so common in the earlier days of that event. Not a lot of information seems to be available to us about this incredible creation.

It's possible the forks are

Marzocchi with perhaps a Yamaha front brake. The frame

is tough to identify. Best guess is KTM - maybe. Swinging arm is from a Husqvarna dirt bike of the period, and it looks like S&W made-in-Mexico shocks keep the rear wheel from munching its mudguard.

In spite of all this, if you stand back and check it out objectively, it's difficult to pick that the bike itself isn't the result of a factory effort. Not so, though. It's a bitsa in the literal sense, well imagined and engineered. But there are a few giveaways. Note the spare rear sprocket bolted to the front downtube, and the touring-looking luggage/fuel/water assembly piled on the back. Plus the hammer and multigrips! That subframe probably suffered severely, as the concensus appears to be that Eugen failed to finish the event. Which is no real surprise considering the harshness of the true desert country (Tenere et al), and the relatively unsophisticated machinery competing 41 years ago in the real Paris to Dakar (capital of West African Senegal) Rally. When adventure was as big an attraction as the Event.

So hats off to Eugen and his fellow travellers, and thanks to him for showing us what a great dirt bike an A65 can be!

Following on from the success of British Motorcycle Day over the last two years, the Festival of Motorcycling is holding European Motorcycle Day as the first event of the 2024 program.

It's in Balhannah again in the picturesque Adelaide Hills, on Sunday February 18.

The public attending the event can enjoy a fun filled day of race bike start-ups, food vans, music from all eras and countries, a free costume competition and the sight of hundreds of bikes from all over Europe. A free raffle will be held during the day.

Motorcyclists entering their bikes in the Show and Shine (for an additional \$5) can win trophies and prizes, as well as enjoying the pleasure of displaying their pride and joy in a secure and safe location among fellow enthusiasts.

This is the first event of the Festival of Motorcycling calendar for the year, with proceeds raising funds again for the South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute.

We have planned a fun day for the public and motorcycling fraternity alike. On the day, festival goers can expect food stalls, regalia sales, music and race bike start-ups.

The event is open to all European Motorcycle owners, from antique to current models and we're even letting Britain re-join the EU so that British Bike owners can join in the day! There will be onsite parking for non-EU bikes so that Japanese and American motorcycle owners can enter the grounds and not worry about their machines being out on the street, all included in the entry. The Entry fee of \$5 at the gate for pedestrians and motorcyclists alike is cash only.

Supporters of the day are Old Bike Australasia, the Royal Automobile Association of SA and the Adelaide Hills Council.

The event will be held at the Balhannah Oval from 10am - 3pm.






1952 Maudes Trophy (Thanks To Motor Cycle Magazine)

The Auto Cycle Union of Great Britain has awarded the Maudes Trophy to BSA for the most meritorious observed motorcycling performance of the year.

Three stock model BSA Star Twins were selected by the official ACU observer, Mr J McNulty, from a batch of 35 passing through the finishing department of the BSA works early in September.

These machines were marked with special paint, and their engines and components sealed. From then on the machines were under the direct supervision of the observer, unless he impounded them under lock and key with his own personal seal on the door.



On September 7th the three machines, ridden by prominent British riders Fred Rist, Norman Vanhouse and Brian Martin left Birmingham accompanied by Mr McNulty. Their route was to take them through nine countries. From September 18 to the 23rd, they were in the International Six-Days' Trial riding through the Austrian provinces of Styria and Carinthia in the British Zone, and Salzburg and Upper Austria in the US zone.

Competition from top-flight Continental riders and machines was met, but, despite the rigors of the course and bad weather, each BSA rider was awarded a gold medal, having covered the course without loss of marks.

After the International Six-Days' Trial, the machines continued their road test, passing

'Run Etiquette'

<u>OR</u>

How NOT to lose club members on Club Runs.

- Please arrive at club run departure points with a full tank of petrol.
- No passing the leaders of the groups.
- The leader of the run will point to the corner and the person immediately behind the leader will drop off and wait for 'Tail End Charlie' or the back-up trailer, whichever is nominated at the beginning of the run, to pass. (Please note this is not applicable to sidecars due to the difficulty in pulling off to the side of the road, and the possibility of obstructing traffic due to the extra width). This way the run leader will know that all corners or changes of directions are covered. This should ensure that the run stays together.
- No individual deviation from the designated run unless first advising the leader and Tail End Charlie - stick to follow the leader.
- Be mindful of travelling as a group. Do not get too close to the bike in front. Maintain a safe distance between bikes.
- Where possible lead and tail riders will wear Hi-Vis jackets.
- These guidelines are set out to keep the rides running smoothly. Please adhere to them for the benefit of all riders and accompanying cars, including the back up trailer.
- Remember your safety is our number one concern.
- Marshals will be wearing hi-vis jackets and directional armbands.

through Germany, Denmark and Sweden to the finishing point in Oslo on September 30.

Mr McNulty made a detailed report of his observations to the ACU, in which he included a record of every attention the machines had received, and later the ACU issued a certificate of performance.

The Maudes Trophy was first introduced by the ACU in 1923 and was last awarded in 1939.

On October 9 of this year (1952), the ACU competitions committee considered the report of their observer on the BSAs' performance, and subsequently made the new award.


This is one of the three BSA Star Twins that competed in the 1952 International Six-Days' Trial.
