#### **BSA Rocket 3-derived DOHC V6**

Is this amazing, fuel-injected creation worthy of the famous Allen Millyard? Not very far off! It was designed, cut, welded and built by its owner George Pooley.

George gained experience by designing and making OHC cam boxes for his Rocket 3. So this is the next step in his creativity.

The V6 is a marriage of bits from two A75 triples. Like Allen Millyard, the two cases were cut and welded to create the engine's basis. From his previous efforts, George designed and made the cam boxes.

He is a man of varied talents. He's also responsible for most of the ancilliaries, such as the fuel and oil tanks, seat and engine plates.

All he would say about the crankshaft is that it has been 'reworked'. That's got to be the understatement of the century!

Not sure how he managed it, but George shoehorned this stunning V6 into a Rob North frame, with help of, and rejigging at, Trident Motorcycles.

It may be that cooling is a bit of an issue. As you can see, there are two oil coolers mounted in the headlight's position.

It's not known whether this is to be a road-going thing of beauty, as it's a 'work in progress.'

Meanwhile, Mr Pooley's creations (there seem to be quite few) are to be seen at racing circuits and shows around the UK.

Pity they aren't here, but we have Norm Fraser!

Weatherwise, on Sunday morning the sky was overcast with occasional light showers. As I filled the Bushman's tank with 25:1 petrol/oil mix the rain stopped temporarily. I donned my riding gear and was off down the McLaren Vale Main Road up to Kangarilla Road, turned left for a short ride to the winery and into the car park.

Bryan Dunn and Jeff Cleary, the ride organisers, were already there welcoming members and talking about the morning's ride. More riders turned up, and by 9:30 approximately 25 riders had arrived. As this ride is designated as a "small bike ride" I was not naïve enough to think that the car park would be filled with Beagles, Dandys, Bantams and even Winged Wheels. Instead there were many other BSA models, including pre-WW2 machines.

While it was still raining we gathered under a large tree while Bryan gave the obligatory safety message, and described the route we would take. Due to the rain, it had been decided to shorten the run to remove two steep downhill sections with hairpin bends in deference to the slippery conditions. We were to stop at Kangarilla for a regroup with marshals and back-up vehicle. Then the group would continue on to Meadows, where the "Pick a Pie" establishment had been notified of our visit.

Then we were off, along Kangarilla Road through McLaren Flat, then on to Kangarilla. We stopped outside the local church. I hope the parishioners weren't too concerned when 24 motorcycle riders stopped outside their place of worship. By then the black Bantam had made it's way onto the trailer, having decided a Sunday morning run in the rain was not for it. We restarted, and travelling at a steady 35 to 40 MPH soon arrived at Meadows.

Many members availed themselves of the gastronomic delights provided by the Pick a Pie proprieters, while some others inspected the assembled machines outside. After said gastronomic delights had been consumed, another talk from Bryan outlined the ride back to the winery via Schulers Road for some different scenery.

Once more we were off. The rain started again, with large, heavy drops that felt like small hailstones. A right hand turn and we were on Schulers Road. A couple more turns and we were back on Kangarilla Road heading for the winery. After arriving around midday some members said goodbye and returned home.

Tables had been booked, and approximately 15 members sat down for lunch. After eating, Bryan handed out raffle tickets for bottles of Oxenberry Wines. The management of the winery had generously donated four bottles of wine for the Club's use. I arrived early on my Huntmaster to find the mill had filled with motorcycles. There was a display of "Made in Australia" - mainly South Australia, from the earliest - an around 1904 Lewis - to the latest Tilbrook. Fantastic to see. From there, there was a vast array of bikes from around the world. Some were totally original, others had been restored. I'd guess at around 200 all up.

## **HISTORICALLY REGISTERING BIKE(S)**

#### Things you need to be aware of!

Before the end of the financial year, if you have a motorcycle(s) on conditional/historic registration with any club, you MUST do the following.

- 1. Renew membership.
- 2. Supply rego papers for restamping (blue copy).
- 3. Supply log book(s) for restamping.

This can be done at one of our logbook days or posted directly to Club PO Box.. Details of this can be found on page 2.

#### Please Note:

Failure to do this before the <u>30th June</u> each year will result, technically, in your bike(s) being unregistered and uninsured. Heavy penalties can be imposed by the police if you are caught riding your bike unregistered.

Further more, if you are not financial, the club has an legal obligation to inform the Register of Motor Vehicles of any member who is not financial. This is non negotiable. It is a requirement of the 'Concessional (Historic) Registration Scheme. The club has no option in this matter! Subsequently your registration and insurance will be cancelled by the Dept. of Motor Vehicles.








B.S.A. Motor Bicycles for the Front. From a 1914 history booklet

### 'Run Etiquette'

<u>OR</u>

How NOT to lose club members on Club Runs.

- Please arrive at club run departure points with a full tank of petrol.
- No passing the leaders of the groups.
- The leader of the run will point to the corner and the person immediately behind the leader will drop off and wait for 'Tail End Charlie' or the back-up trailer which ever is nominated at the beginning of the run, to pass. (Please note this is not applicable to sidecars due to the difficulty in pulling off to the side of the road, and the possibility of obstructing traffic due to the extra width). This way the run leader will know that all corners or change of directions are covered. This should ensure that the run stays together.
- No individual deviation from the designated run unless first advising the leader and Tail End Charlie - stick to follow the leader.
- 'Be mindful of travelling as a group. Do not get too close to the bike in front. Maintain a safe distance between bikes.
- Where possible lead and tail riders will wear Hi-Vis jackets.
- These guidelines are set down to keep the runs running smooth, please adhere to them for the benefit of all riders and accompanying cars including the back up trailer.
- Remember your safety is our number one concern.
- Marshals will be wearing hi-vis jackets and directional armbands.


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
